Dear Frances Vorwerg parents

How often have you thought of a loved, a family member or a close friend and wandered how on earth they could have ended up in the situation in which they find themselves.

To make this question a bit more personal, let me ask, have you ever felt as if you have run out of prayers for a prodigal son, daughter or family member (a teenager, a niece or nephew, or a spouse) and that person is still running headlong toward destruction? If so, you might identify with Hosea, the Old Testament prophet who had a family member who continually strayed on to the wrong path. God said that he would block her path with thorn bushes and wall her in so that she couldn't stray from home.

When people we love don't have the wisdom to see the destructive paths they are on, we can pray for a "hedge of thorns." We ask God to separate our loved ones from destructive influences, to cause those who lure them into evil to lose interest in doing wrong and to cause the prodigals, those who stray, to lose interest in activities that will lure them away from our families. Praying like this can form a barricade, or a double-sided hedge, to keep destructive influences out and our loved one's in. Through prayer, God can remove wrong influences and frustrate the prodigal person's attempts to get to them. When that happens, I encourage you to pray that those who are in trouble, who want to stray or who find themselves in difficult circumstance to turn to God.

I encourage you to prayer along these lines as you seek help in caring for your family, loved ones and friends: 'LORD, I ask you to build a hedge of thorns around my friend, to separate my loved one from any influence not ordained by you. I pray that those who are a bad influence will lose interest and move away and that my family members will lose interest in wrong doing as well. May the hedge of thorns that You put in place, protect and defend us anything that will my family harm.'

Remember, God is eager and able to deliver and bless the world and those who call to Him. Be blessed as you look to God for your family's needs.
