Having a tough time removing a stain? Try these helpful hints!

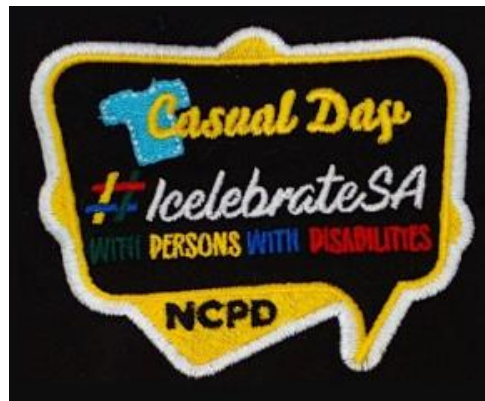


Well done to the learners. You really were great entrepreneurs today!



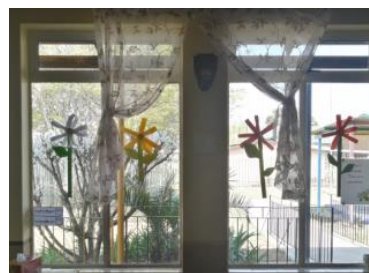
## Casual Day
