Frances Vorweg has a long and wonderful history of serving children and the community who have being diagnosed with cerebral palsy. To date many, many children have passed through the gates of the school and been served.

Frances Vorweg started the school in the early 70's in a building situated in Crown Mines and later moved to the present site to continue the service to the community.

Currently the school services the community from Van der Bijl Park to Orange Farm, Alberton, Drieziek, Lenasia, Walkerville, South Hills and Alberton to name but a few areas.

Frances Vorweg has 53 professional staffers who serve the school as therapists, teachers and nurses and over 47 assistant, admin and support staff who provide maintenance, finance, administration, learner assistance, hostel and incontinence services. We are proud today to celebrate the heritage of Frances Vorweg within the CP community.
