The Netball girls (U/14 and u/16 will also play against Robertsham Primary.

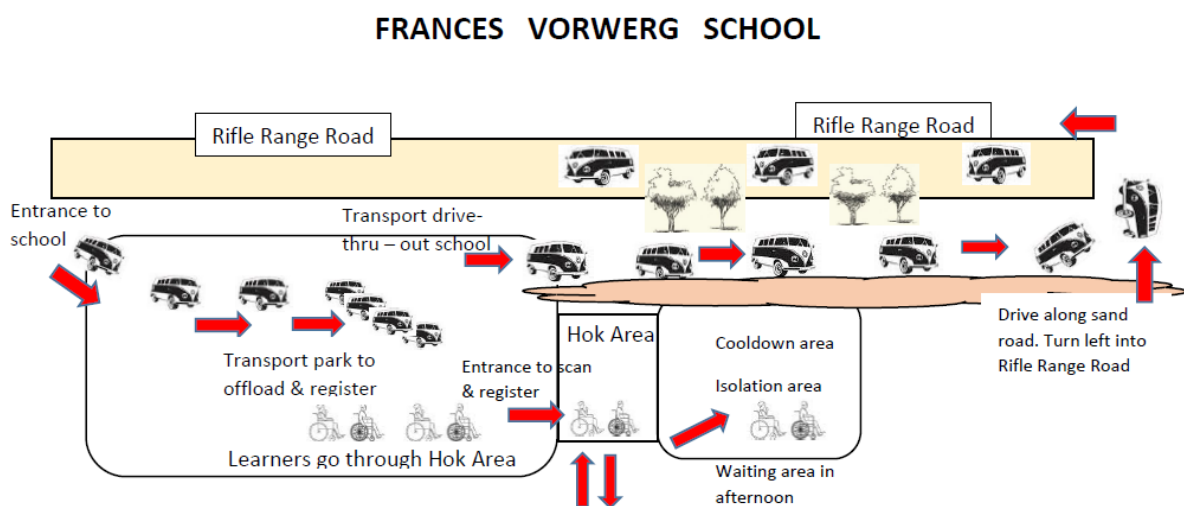
We wish to thank Robertsham for making the arrangements to play at Frances Vorweg and for their willingness to be a party of Frances Vorweg's sports programme.

Covid-19

The Department has provided the directive for Covid rules at the school. The following will apply to Frances Vorweg:

- Masks must be worn in contained or small areas – thus in cars, vehicles, transport, etc.
- Masks must be worn in classrooms
- Masks may be removed when outside of the class/building in area where there is fresh air and wind-flow (such as the playgrounds).
- All learners must sanitise hands on the way into school and on entering the classroom
- Temperature scanning will no longer take place, BUT, all learner will learners their medication at the SAME ENTRANCE POINT – as it was during the Covid Pandemic months.
- School times remain the same and all learners are expected to be at school by 07:30 daily.

Traffic flow – we ask parents to continue the use of travelling through the school and turning in to the main road, this has worked well during the past while, and the needs to be followed in the future as well.
